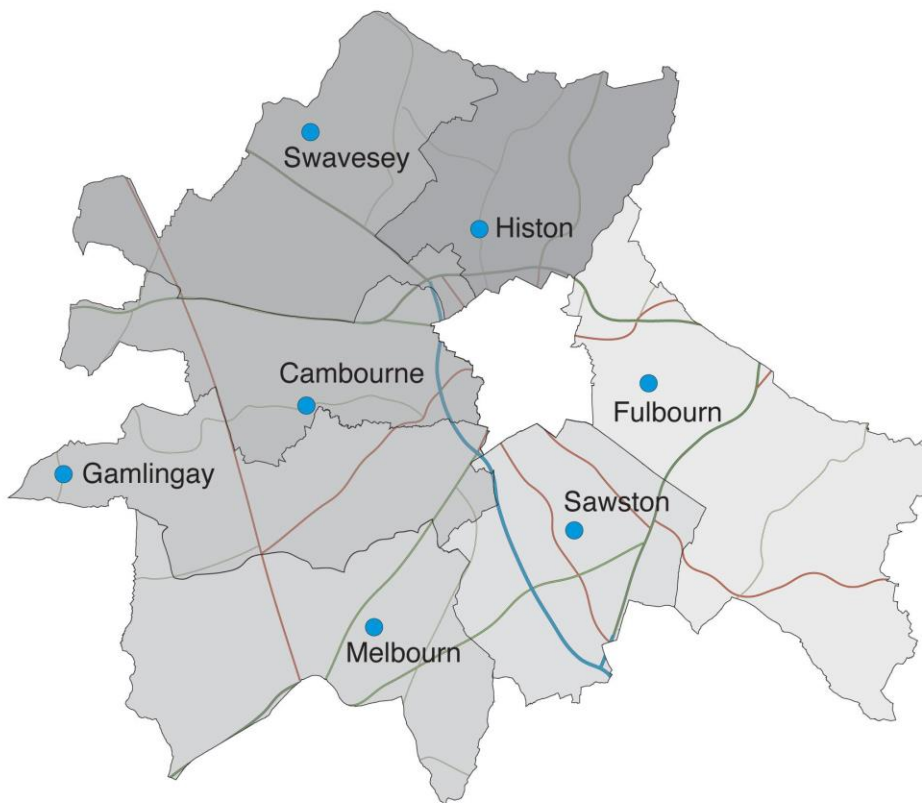




Cam bourne Area Meeting

Tuesday 11th Feb 2014



1. Welcome – This document is presented prior to the next public meeting for the Cambourne area which is to be held on Tuesday 11th Feb 2014. Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) data for your neighbourhood can also be found at www.police.uk and can be accessed by anyone. The aim of a panel meeting is:

- For the Police to highlight emerging or concerning trends in crime and anti-social behaviour, and be available to discuss these in a public forum.
- To listen and take note of concerns presented by individuals, parish councils, volunteer organisations such as Neighbourhood and Speed Watch, elected members and other residents or local associations.
- For the panel to decide areas of concern for the community and Police to prioritise as part of local Policing activities.
- To provide an update on the actions taken in regards to previously chosen priorities or other emerging trends.

Speeding – Concerns about road safety are to be dealt with as a matter of course by the Police. The Police and local Parishes are developing a more focused partnership approach to road safety. Concerns about road safety should be directed primarily towards your parish council who in partnership with the Count Council Highways Department and the Police will develop a multi-agency plan to deal with localised problem areas. Parishes are to play a key role in leading Speedwatch teams, gathering evidence to support longer term improvements to roads, and directing Police to hotspots for enforcement.

3. Update on current priorities

All Areas	
Objective	To address the Panel concerns relating to dwelling and non-dwelling burglaries across the Cambourne Panel area.
Action Taken	<p>Op Oaklands was initiated in response to similar concerns raised across the South Cambridgeshire Policing Command. The operation entailed all available operational staff visiting the nominated village for a 24 hour period to conduct proactive crime prevention activity.</p> <p>A full update on Operation Oaklands will be provided by Insp Sutherland at the meeting but a summary of the excellent results includes;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4300 home security checks conducted • 800 shed security checks conducted • Over 400 insecure vehicles identified to owners • Over 250 insecure houses identified to householders • 200 shed alarms sold • 600 views of our shed security video on You Tube

Current Situation	<p>Non dwelling burglaries for January 2014 were the lowest recorded for 12 months within the Cambourne policing area. Dwelling burglaries saw a significant reduction compared with the previous month.</p> <p>Burglary prevention and patrols remains a daily priority for the whole of the South Cambridgeshire Command.</p>

4. Local concerns raised via parish councils

The following items have been received from parish councils as current concerns;

Madingley - The amount and speed of traffic through the village and the dangerous positioning of the traffic calming at the top of Church Lane.

Wimpole – There are proposals to resurrect the Speedwatch group in the village but concerns were raised as to the support and feedback that would be supplied by the Police once this takes place.

The Eversdens - The issues of particular concern are; ‘Visible Police Presence’, and ‘Theft’.
